ORDINANCE

EXTENDING FUNERAL ASSISTANCE/SERVICES TO THE FAMILY OR RELATIVES OF QUALIFIED INDIGENT RESIDENT OF QUEZON CITY; APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY FUNDS THEREFOR.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Quezon City in session assembled :

SECTION 4. The Quezon City Government shall extend funeral services/assistance to the family or relatives of any qualified deceased indigent resident of Quezon City;

SECTION 2. Definition of terms:

a. Relative/s - shall mean either the husband, wife, father, mother, child or brother/sister of the deceased. In the absence of the above, any relative of the deceased up to the sixth (6th) civil degree;

b. Qualified indigent resident - refers to a deceased person who has resided in Quezon City for at least six (6) months prior to his/her death as certified by the barangay captain or his duly authorized representative and whose income during the immediate preceding year is not more than Twelve Thousand (P12,000.00) Pesos and whose net assets or estate is not more than P20,000.00;

SECTION 3. Except for the coffin which shall be sold at cost or at not more than Fifty (50%) percent of the commercial price, which ever is lower and the cost of burial permit fees and burial space (lot), the free services/assistance of the City government shall consists of:
