WHEREAS, several ordinances of Quezon City per-
taining to the regulation of the sale, serving and
consumption of intoxicating liquor or alcoholic
beverages, beer and wine resulted to confusion in
the implementation thereof;

WHEREAS, in view of the absence of an ordinance
incorporating all ordinances regulating the sale of
liquor or other intoxicating beverages and without
properly identifying the concerned local government
agency thereof, there is difficulty in implementing
provisions of said ordinances;

WHEREAS, ~~the uncontrolled disposal~~ of liquor or
intoxicating beverages within the prohibited radius
has contributed immensely to the alarming incidence
of juvenile delinquency and criminality in the City;

WHEREAS, the baneful effect of drunkenness if not
effectively checked would disrupt the morals, under-
mine public order and the stability of state;

WHEREAS, there is urgent necessity to reinforce
the drive against alcoholism in the City;

WHEREAS, all taxes and fees due the City from
the sale of liquor and intoxicating beverages are
presumed not properly and fully collected and there-
by the City is losing plenty of revenue from the
source.
