**ORDINANCE**

**UPGRADING THE SOCIAL WELFARE SERVICES DIVISION TO A DEPARTMENT TO BE KNOWN AS THE SOCIAL SERVICES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT PROVIDING FOR ITS FUNCTIONS, AND APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF ELEVEN MILLION FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-EIGHT THOUSAND AND TWENTY PESOS (P11,458,020.00) OUT OF ANY AVAILABLE FUNDS IN THE CITY TREASURY TO COVER THE FUNDING REQUIREMENTS THEREOF.**

**WHEREAS, in 1954 the Social Welfare Services Division originated as a local branch of the Social Welfare Administration (now the Department of Social Welfare) and relied on the latter for technical assistance and coordination for the dissemination of social services;**

**WHEREAS, in 1957 the operational expenses and salaries of the office personnel was wholly funded by the Quezon City Government;**

**WHEREAS, in 1972 the Social Welfare Services Division adopted a program aimed at self-sufficiency and socio-economic upliftment wherein social welfare now encompasses a wider range of services catering to more disadvantaged groups;**

**WHEREAS, the services include Family Enrichment Programs, Community Welfare Programs, the Livelihood Programs, the Melave Youth Home and the Reception and Action Center for Youth Offenders and Medicants;**
