PROPOSED RESOLUTION NO. _____, S-2018

A RESOLUTION GRANTING A SPECIAL PERMIT TO EXTREME BLACKOUT GAMING AND ENTERTAINMENT CORPORATION, REPRESENTED BY MR. MIGUEL T. FRANCISCO, TO OPERATE AN ELECTRONIC BINGO BOUTIQUE AT VIRKA BUILDING, 1191 EDSA CORNER ROOSEVELT AVENUE, QUEZON CITY, SUBJECT TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE PHILIPPINE AMUSEMENT AND GAMING CORPORATION (PAGCOR).

WHEREAS, EXTREME BLACKOUT GAMING and ENTERTAINMENT CORPORATION, a domestic corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of Philippine laws, represented by Miguel T. Francisco, is applying for a Special Permit to operate an Electronic Bingo Boutique to be located in Virka Building, 1191 EDSA corner Roosevelt Avenue, Quezon City;

WHEREAS, to enable the applicant to operate the aforesaid Electronic Bingo Boutique, there is a need to secure a Special Permit from the City Council pursuant to an existing city ordinance;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, in relation to existing city ordinances, authorizes the City Council to grant special permit to business activity of the same nature.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to grant, as it does hereby grant, a Special Permit to EXTREME BLACKOUT GAMING and ENTERTAINMENT CORPORATION, represented by Mr. Miguel T. Francisco, to operate an Electronic Bingo Boutique at Virka Building located at No. 1191 EDSA corner Roosevelt Avenue, Quezon City, subject to the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR).

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the authority to operate Bingo Boutique granted herein shall be subject to the following conditions:

- a. The holding of Bingo Boutique shall be in accordance with the Rules and Regulations promulgated by PAGCOR;
- b. The operation of Bingo Boutique shall not include the playing of games not related to or other than bingo;
- c. The operator is enjoined to prohibit individuals below eighteen (18) years of age from playing in the above-mentioned games;
- d. The operator/applicant shall remit to the City Treasurer a franchise fee of three percent (3%) of the gross revenue of herein grantee, which shall be made payable to the City Treasury during the lifetime of the measure.

RESOLVED, FINALLY, that this Special Permit to operate a Bingo Boutique shall be valid for a period of two (2) years from the approval of this Resolution and maybe renewed by the City Council.
