ORDINANCE

CREATING THE RADIO COMMUNICATIONS SERVICE UNDER THE OFFICE OF THE CITY MAYOR THAT WILL DEFINE, INSTALL, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN AN INTEGRATED COMMUNICATION SYSTEM FOR THE CITY GOVERNMENT AND REPROGRAMMING THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED SIX THOUSAND AND NINE HUNDRED TWENTY-FOUR PESOS (P1,706,924.00) TO COVER THE NECESSARY FUNDING REQUIREMENTS THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, with the ever increasing and pressing clamor and demands of the public government action and essential public services, the need for coordinated, reliable, fast and efficient communications facilities, system and services have become imperative;

WHEREAS, in order to realize the aforesaid goals and objectives and satisfy the public need along this line, the establishment of an office to administer, coordinate, monitor and/or manage the affairs, functions and responsibilities aforesaid mentioned has all the more become exigent and equally imperative under the circumstances;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it enacted by the City Council of Quezon City in session assembled:

SECTION 1. Under the Office of the City Mayor, there is hereby created the Radio Communications Service to be headed by a Communications Service Officer with a rank and salary equivalent to Grade 25 and who must be at least a Bachelor's degree holder and with first grade (Professional) Civil service eligibility and radio communications background.

SECTION 2. The following positions with their respective numbers, titles, salary grades, monthly and yearly salary rates are hereby further created, as follows:

SECTION 3. The Office shall combine the different existing communications system into one effective, efficient, continuous and cost effective integrated communications system.

SECTION 4. In addition to such duties, functions and responsibilities attached to the positions created, the Communications Office created under this Ordinance shall:

- a. Take charge of the establishment of appropriate fast, efficient, reliable, coordinated and/or integrated communications system for City Government.
- b. Manage the day-to-day operations and activities of the Office.
- c. Acquire, install and/or operate such radio communication devices and facilities which are deemed necessary to carry out the goals, objectives, functions and responsibilities of the Office.
- d. Shall see to it that the City Government complies with all laws, rules and regulations pertaining to the operations of radio communications systems and other facilities.


SECTION 5. There is hereby reprogrammed out of any available funds under the Office of the City Mayor the amount of One Million Seven Hundred Six Thousand and Nine Hundred Twenty-Four Pesos (P1,706,924.00) to cover the financial requirements of this Ordinance, as follows:


Personal Services	- P1,206,924.00
Maintenance & Operating Expenses	- 250,000.00
Capital Outlay	- 250,000.00

SECTION 6. Personnel under the City Government that are presently performing duties and functions which have to do with the Office created under this Ordinance shall be accordingly absorbed under the Office herein created and be given appropriate position titles in accordance with Section Two hereof and all radio communication equipment and facilities presently under the control of other offices in the City Government are hereby accordingly transferred to this Office.


SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.


