ORDINANCE NO. SP- 1169, S-2002

AN ORDINANCE RENAMING NOVALICHES HIGH SCHOOL, SAN BARTOLOME ANNEX TO SAN BARTOLOME HIGH SCHOOL, AND DECLARING ITS SEPARATION FROM ITS MOTHER SCHOOL, NOVALICHES HIGH SCHOOL.

WHEREAS, DECS Order No. 84, S-1996 provides all the necessary requirements for a Public Secondary annexes and the authority to be separated from their mother institution;

"All Public Secondary annexes shall be given the authority to be separated from their mother institution and that an annex of a public high school which is presently offering the complete secondary education program or one which shall offer fourth year level by next year shall be established as a new high school effective SY 1997-98 and also all existing annexes or those which shall be established in the future shall be considered as a new High School during the school year when they shall begin to offer fourth year level"

WHEREAS, the San Bartolome Annex High School located in Barangay San Bartolome, District II, Quezon City, has been in existence for nine (9) years since its opening in 1992 and is continuously providing the basic secondary education of young students, mostly coming from the depressed areas and economically deprived families residing in the neighboring communities;

WHEREAS, San Bartolome Annex High School has a school site with an area of seven thousand six hundred seventy-seven square meters (7,677 sq.m.), an existing three-storey two (2) school buildings with thirty-nine (39) classrooms, where the students hold their classes at a ratio of sixty five (65) students per teacher (65:1);

WHEREAS, there is no other high school within five kilometers from San Bartolome Annex High School to accommodate the graduates of the elementary schools such as Goodwill Elementary School, San Bartolome Elementary School, Bagbag Elementary School, Placido Del Mundo Elementary School and Odebo Elementary School;

WHEREAS, San Bartolome Annex High School has a total population of Four Thousand Five Hundred (4,500) students with one hundred three (103) regular teaching personnel, one (1) Head Teacher Officer-In-Charge, holding a doctoral degree, and four (4) non-teaching personnel working and taking care of the operation and management of the school affairs;

WHEREAS, the need to make this annex, an independent school, separated from its mother institution is but urgent to provide the students of San Bartolome Annex High School with much improved environment and facilities conducive for learning;

WHEREAS, all the teaching force, administrator, personnel, parents, and students, as well as the whole community of San Bartolome and other nearby barangays firmly believe that it is high time for the school to be granted its independence.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. The Novaliches High School, San Bartolome Annex, is hereby renamed as San Bartolome High School and separated from its mother school, Novaliches, High School.


SECTION 2. The land where the school is located shall be for the exclusive use of the school.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
