ORDINANCE NO. SP-1899, S-2008

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING ALL MAJOR BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF QUEZON CITY TO PROVIDE PARKING SPACES FOR MOTORBIKES, PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREOF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

*WHEREAS, it is hereby declared the policy of the Quezon City Government to protect the rights to property of its residents;*

*WHEREAS, the Quezon City Police District, through its Anti-Carnapping Section has expressed alarm over the growing incidents of motorcycle thefts in several business establishments prompting them to seek support from the City Council for the enactment of an Ordinance that would require the establishment of parking spaces for motorbikes in major establishments.*

**NOW, THEREFORE**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:**

**SECTION 1. Title - This Ordinance shall be known as "The Motorbike Parking Ordinance".**

**SECTION 2. All major business establishments, particularly Malls, Banks, Restaurants, Hospitals, and the likes, are hereby required to provide Parking Spaces.**

**SECTION 3. The Business Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO) is hereby mandated to require the subject business establishments to comply with Section 2 of this Ordinance as a pre-requisite in the grant of renewal of their business permits.**

**SECTION 4. Penalties - Any establishment who violates that provisions of this ordinance shall suffer the penalty of not more than one (1) year of imprisonment or a fine of not more than Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) or both at the discretion of the court. When the offender is a corporation, the Chief Executive or its officers shall be meted said penalties.**


**SECTION 5. Repealing Clause - All provisions of city ordinances, executive orders or resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.**

**SECTION 6. Separability Clause - If for any reason or reasons any part of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.**

**SECTION 7. Effectivity** - This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after and its publication at least once in a newspaper of general circulation.


