ORDINANCE NO. SP- 2278, S-2014

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES AT SAN BARTOLOME HIGH SCHOOL AND APPROPRIATING NECESSARY FUNDS THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10533, otherwise known as the Enhanced Basic Education Act, seeks to strengthen the education curriculum and increase the number of years for basic education;

WHEREAS, the enhanced basic education program encompasses at least one (1) year of kindergarten education, six (6) years of elementary education, and six (6) years of secondary education. Secondary education includes four (4) years of junior high school and two (2) years of senior high school education;

WHEREAS, Senior High School students will choose among the four (4) Tracks, namely, Academic Track, Sports Track, Arts Track, and Technical-Vocational Tracks, each having its own Strands or specialization;

WHEREAS, in 2016, more than 40,000 students are projected to enroll in Grade 11, this excludes possible enrollees from the private educational institutions and students from our neighbouring cities;

WHEREAS, for District 5, the Quezon City Division of City Schools projects 9,927 enrollees;

WHEREAS, the plan of the Division of City Schools is to include San Bartolome High School as one of the sites for its Senior High School;

WHEREAS, San Bartolome High School conducted a survey aimed to determine the desired Tracks of its Grade 8 students who will be amongst the first Grade 11 students in 2016;

WHEREAS, out of 1,596 respondents, 53% chose the Academic track, 32% selected Sports and Arts, and 14% chose the Technical-Vocational-Livelihood track;

WHEREAS, with the main objective of successfully implementing the Senior High School Education, there is a need to construct additional school buildings and facilities in San Bartolome High School, taking into consideration its survey result and the Quezon City's comprehensive senior high school implementation plan.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. The Office of the City Engineer and the Special Design Group, in coordination with the Division of City Schools, are hereby mandated to make the necessary plans and cost estimates for the construction of new school buildings and facilities for San Bartolome High School.

SECTION 2. Copies of the plans and cost estimates shall be submitted to the Local School Board for their review.

SECTION 3. Upon ensuring that plans and cost estimates are aligned with the City's comprehensive senior high school implementation plan, the Local School Board shall allocate from the Special Education Fund the amount necessary, subject to all legal and existing rules and procedures.

SECTION 4. If any part or section of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional for any reason whatsoever such declaration shall not in any way affect the other parts or sections of this ordinance.
