ORDINANCE NO. SP- **2722**, S-2018

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING THE MINIMUM THICKNESS AND CONCRETE BASE COMPOSITION OF THE VAULTS USED IN ALL PAWNSHOPS IN QUEZON CITY, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of 1991 expressly grants the Sangguniang Panlungsod the power to enact and approve ordinances meant to prevent and suppress lawlessness, disorder and violence and impose penalties;

WHEREAS, there has been a rise in the number of cases of break-in robberies wherein the vaults of banks as well as pawnshops were perforated by drilling a hole underground to gain access and empty its contents;

WHEREAS, setting a standard minimum thickness and composition of the concrete base where the vault will be fixed will further secure the valuables contained therein.

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NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN
REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. TITLE - "An Ordinance Prescribing The Minimum
Thickness and Concrete Base Composition of The Vaults Used In All
Pawnshops in Quezon City, And Providing Penalties For Violations
Thereof."

SECTION 2. MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS - Upon consultation,
the Department of Building Official of Quezon City has recommended
the specific thickness of the concrete base of the vaults, as well as the
composition or materials used therein, to wit:

1. FLOOR: Reinforced Concrete (1:1 ½ :3) 300MM Thick

REINFORCEMENT: 12mm diameter of deformed bars at
150mm on center, both ways at the top
and bottom faces of slab (A formation of
reinforcement mat of 150mm x 150mm
on either face of the wall to be obtained.)

MATERIAL STRENGTH:

Concrete $F'_c=27$ MPa (4000psi)
Steel $F_y=275$ Mpa (Grade 40)

The reinforcement shall be staggered in
such a manner that any view taken at right
angles to the mat formation would show
reinforcement at every 75cm centre to
centre.

SECTION 3. IMPLEMENTATION - Upon the approval of this
Ordinance, the Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO) shall
notify all pawnshops in the City that such minimum requirements shall
be complied with for the purpose of renewing business
permits/licenses.

SECTION 4. PENALTIES - A fine of Five Thousand Pesos
(Php5,000.00) shall be imposed for non-compliance of this Ordinance
as well as the cancellation or revocation of the business permit of the
pawnshop/s. y

SECTION 5. REPEALING CLAUSE - All ordinances, resolutions, local executive orders, rules and regulations, or any part thereof inconsistent herewith are deemed repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE - In case any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.


