ORDINANCE NO. SP- **2992**, S-2020

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A MONTHLY INCENTIVE ALLOWANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (PHP500.00) EACH TO ALL THE REGULAR BARANGAY PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS (BPSO) OF THE 142 BARANGAYS IN QUEZON CITY FOR THE YEARS 2020 TO 2022, AND APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY FUNDS THEREFOR.

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WHEREAS, Section 11, Article XIII of the 1987 Philippine Constitution expressly provides that the State shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development and its protection, and shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and other social services available to all;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of 1991 likewise empowers the Sangguniang Panlungsod to promote and protect the general welfare of its inhabitants, specifically by enacting appropriate legislative measures;

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WHEREAS, the City recognizes the role played by Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSO) and such protection and welfare should likewise be extended to them, whose life and limb are often put at risk being the frontliners in the maintenance of peace and order;

WHEREAS, such additional incentive will further assist them in the faithful discharge of their constitutionally sanctioned function to protect the safety and security of the residents of the City:

WHEREAS, the 21<sup>st</sup> City Council already passed and approved Resolution No. SP-8053, S-2019, authorizing the City Mayor to grant a Five Hundred Pesos (Php500.00) Monthly Incentive Allowance each to all regular BPSOs of the 142 Barangays in Quezon City;

WHEREAS, the grant of said incentive allowance is one of the programs included in the Quezon City Peace and Order and Public Safety Plan (POPS Plan) for the years 2020 – 2022 as certified by the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG).

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. DECLARATION POLICY. – The Local Government of Quezon City recognizes the vital role of the Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSOs) in the maintenance of peace and order, as well as the protection and security of the residents of the City.


SECTION 2. COVERAGE. – All regular BPSOs shall mean those designated and under plantilla position of the Barangay. They shall be entitled to a monthly incentive allowance of Php500.00 for the years 2020 to 2022 which will be released by the City on a quarterly basis.


SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. – The funds necessary for the grant of the monthly incentive allowance shall be taken from the budget of the Office of the City Mayor and shall be included in the annual budget in the succeeding years.

SECTION 4. REPEALING CLAUSE. – All ordinances, resolutions, local executive orders, rules and regulations or any part thereof inconsistent herewith are deemed repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

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





*SECTION 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. – In case any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.*

*SECTION 6. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. – This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after the publication requirements have been complied with.*
