ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR A NEW SALARY SCHEDULE FOR ALL OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT AND APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY FUNDS THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, Section 21 of Republic Act No. 7199, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, empowers the Sanggunian to determine the compensation of local officials and personnel; Provided, that such compensation may be based upon the pertinent provision of RA 6750; Entitled: "AN ACT PRESCRIBING A REVISED COMPENSATION AND POSITION CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM IN THE GOVERNMENT AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES".

WHEREAS, it is believed that the existing compensation rates of Quezon City Government Officials and employees which were last adjusted more than three years ago on July 1, 1989 are no longer commensurate with the needs and requirements of the present;

WHEREAS, the City Council is, however, cognizant of the present fiscal status of the City and is therefore proposing a minimal salary adjustment which is within the financial capability of the City to grant;

WHEREAS, RA 6750, Section 2, Item b, provides that "the basic compensation for all personnel in the government owned or controlled corporations and financial institutions shall generally be comparable with those in the private sector doing comparable work and must be in accordance with the prevailing laws on minimum wage;"
