ORDINANCE NO. SP-153, s-94

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR GROUP INSURANCE COVERAGE TO REGULAR BARANGAY SECURITY AND DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS (BSDOs) OF ALL BARANGAYS IN QUEZON CITY FOR INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF DUTY AS WELL AS AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR OF QUEZON CITY TO NEGOTIATE AND ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH ANY INSURANCE COMPANY FOR THIS PURPOSE, APPROPRIATING FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P500,000.00) OR SO MUCH THEREOF AND INCORPORATING SAID AMOUNT IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1994.

WHEREAS, Barangay Security and Development Officers (BSDOs), who are on call at all times of the day, are insured only for death in line of duty, but not for injuries sustained in the performance of such;

WHEREAS, considering the nature of the duty of BSDOs, which is the maintenance of peace and order in the barangay and constantly exposes them to all kinds of physical danger, there is a need to provide for insurance coverage for them for injuries sustained in line of duty;

WHEREAS, Paragraph 1 (xiii), Section 458 of RA 7960 provides that the sangguniang panlungsod may provide for group insurance or additional insurance coverage for all barangay officials, including members of barangay tanod brigades;

WHEREAS, Paragraph B (1, vi), Section 445 of RA 7960 provides that the City Mayor shall represent the City in all its business transactions and sign in its behalf all bonds, contracts, and obligations, and such other documents upon authorization by the sangguniang panlungsod or pursuant to law or ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. A group insurance coverage is hereby provided for Barangay Security and Development Officers (BSDOs) for injuries sustained in line of duty.
