**AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING MOTOR SHOPS, BODY REPAIR SHOPS, "TALYERS" AND OTHER SIMILAR ESTABLISHMENTS FROM USING CITY STREETS AND SIDEWALKS AS PART OF THEIR PLACE OF BUSINESS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.**

WHEREAS, motor shops, body repair shops, "talyers", and other similar establishments have rapidly grown in number, to such an extent that even city streets and sidewalks have not been spared in the exercise of their business activities;

WHEREAS, it has been observed that this kind of practice has contributed to the worsening of traffic, deterioration of roads and streets, clogging of the drainage system due to waste materials; furthermore, they have become a nuisance to the community and the public in general by obstructing the passageway, endangering the health and safety of individuals;

WHEREAS, local government units are given the authority under the Local Government Code of 1991, particularly Section 16 and Section 458 (4)(1), (5)(VI) to enact measures that will promote the general welfare, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants;
