ORDINANCE NO. EP-117, S-94

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE USE OF DESIGNATED CITY STREETS AND PROPERTIES AS TRICYCLE TERMINALS AND REQUIRING THE IMPOSITION OF TERMINAL FEES ON ALL TRICYCLE UNITS FRANCHISED IN QUEZON CITY.

WHEREAS, most tricycle units and/or associations occupying and plying the streets of Quezon City do not pay terminal fees, and are thus, without legitimate terminals to the detriment of authorized units, contrary to the intent and purpose of Quezon City Tricycle Ordinance of 1992 which is to maintain the peace, order, harmony, safety and eradicate "colorums" to enable legal units to conduct their activities lawfully;

WHEREAS, the need to regulate and at the same time maintain the aforesaid streets in proper condition are the primary concern of the city government;

WHEREAS, the City Council pursuant to Section 458(5)(v) of the Local Government Code of 1991, the Sanggunian is empowered to regulate the use of streets, avenues, alleys, sidewalks, bridges, parks and other
