ORDINANCE NO. SP 452 S-96

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE FOUR HUNDRED TWELVE (412) FAMILIES WHOSE HOUSES WERE BURNED BY FIRE AT KITANLAD STREET, BARANGAY TATALON, DISTRICT IV, QUEZON CITY, ON OCTOBER 7, 1996, AT THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND PESOS (P2,000.00) PER FAMILY OWNER AND ONE THOUSAND PESOS (P1,000.00) PER FAMILY RENTER/SHARER, AND ALLOCATING THE SUM OF SIX HUNDRED FIFTEEN THOUSAND PESOS (P615,000.00) FROM THE CALAMITY OR EMERGENCY FUND OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OR FROM ANY AVAILABLE FUNDS OF THE CITY TREASURY.

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Council is empowered under Section 458 (a), (1), (iv) of R.A. 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, to "adopt measures to protect the inhabitants of the City from the harmful effects of man-made or natural disasters and calamities, and to provide relief services and assistance for victims during and in the aftermath of said disasters or calamities and their return to productive livelihood following said events.";

WHEREAS, on October 7, 1996, Kitanlad Street, Barangay Tatalon, District IV, Quezon City, was hit by fire rendering homeless, as per census by the Social Services Development Department (SSDD), four hundred twelve (412) families categorized as follows:
