ORDINANCE NO. SP- 488, S-96

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO ATTY. BENJAMIN M. KASALA, WHO RETIRED FROM THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE AS CITY ASSESSOR ON OCTOBER 1, 1996, IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (P250,000.00) ONLY, TO BE TAKEN FROM THE APPROPRIATIONS FOR GRANTS, SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS UNDER THE OFFICE OF THE CITY MAYOR IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 1997.

WHEREAS, Atty. Benjamin M. Kasala had faithfully served Quezon City as City Assessor,

WHEREAS, Atty. Benjamin M. Kasala had rendered thirty-three (33) years of faithful, dedicated and loyal service to the people of Quezon City, twenty-four (24) years of which were spent in the Office of the City Assessor,

WHEREAS, due to poor health, Atty. Kasala tendered his irrevocable resignation effective at the close of office hours on October 1, 1996, which resignation was duly approved by the City Mayor,

WHEREAS, Atty. Kasala, in his capacity as Assistant City Assessor and in close coordination with then City Assessor Constantino P. Rosas, rendered valuable and significant contribution to the passage of Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-357, S-95, which embodied the new schedule of fair market values for land, buildings and other structures in Quezon City,

WHEREAS, the said Schedule of Fair Market Values has resulted in the general revision of real property assessments and thereby enhanced a significant increase in the revenues of the City,

WHEREAS, in recognition of his valuable, faithful and outstanding service to the Quezon City government, it is only fair and just to extend to him financial assistance especially because he retired at the age of sixty-four (64) years, instead of sixty-five (65) years, due to poor health;
