AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THE CHARTER OF THE QUEZON CITY POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY OF 1998 AS AUTHORIZED BY ORDINANCE NO. SP-544, S-97 AND AMENDING THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. TITLE. - The Quezon City Polytechnic University located in Novaliches, Quezon City, is hereby provided its CHARTER and amending at the same time Ordinance No. SP-544, S-97, known as the Pamantasang Politeknikal ng Lungsod Quezon or Quezon City Polytechnic University in accordance with law and within the powers and limitations hereinafter specified, and same to be organized as a Corporation under the same name.

The Quezon City Polytechnic University, located in a parcel of land, consisting of forty thousand (40,000) square meters, more or less, along Quirino Highway, Barangay San Bartolome, Quezon City, bounded on the North by RT Gonzales Village, Carreon Village and Aguirre Compound, in the South by Sinforosa Street and Urbano Street, in the East by Quirino Highway, and on the West by Holy Cross Memorial Park shall be the property and location of the Quezon City Polytechnic University. Any law, ordinance, decree, or promulgation to the contrary, notwithstanding, this land including buildings, facilities, and equipment shall remain the property of the Quezon City Polytechnic University of the Quezon City government.

SECTION 2. POLICY. - It is the declared policy of the Quezon City government, in consonance with the State policy of promoting the rights of the citizens to quality education in all levels to the poor but talented and gifted students of Quezon City and to make such education accessible to all. Further, aware of its obligations in meeting the demands for vocational education and higher technical/technological education, the Quezon City government is committed to expand and raise the level of its Quezon City Polytechnic by enhancing it into a higher education institution as Pamantasang Politeknikal ng Lungsod Quezon or Quezon City Polytechnic University.
