ORDINANCE NO. SP- **1543**, S-2005

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING FREQUENT LEASING OF ANY PUBLIC LAND AS PARKING AREA FOR A PRIVATE GAIN AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES THEREFOR.

Introduced by Councilors RESTITUTO B. MALANGEN, ERIC Z. MEDINA, ANTONIO E. INTON, JR., RAMON P. MEDALLA, JORGE B. BANAL, JR., VOLTAIRE GODOFREDO L. LIBAN III, JOSEPH P. JUICO, FRANCISCO A. CALALAY, JR. and JANET M. MALAYA.

WHEREAS, there is an increasing number of incidence whereby public land which includes pathways, sidewalks, and access roads are being unilaterally leased out as parking areas to private individuals and groups;

WHEREAS, this practice has unjustly enriched certain individuals not only at the expense of the City government but also that of the taxpayers;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. It shall be prohibited to lease public land and facilities, otherwise designated for by the City Council, for the purpose of short term or long term parking purposes.


SECTION 2. Public lands and facilities shall include pathways, sidewalks, roadways, access roads, garages, depots and vacant lots within the immediate vicinity or boundary of the said government property.

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SECTION 3. Violation of this Ordinance shall be penalized by an imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days, or a fine of not more than Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00), or both, at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation.
