ORDINANCE NO. SP- 1546 , S-2005

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL OWNERS AND/OR OPERATORS OF THE MOVIE HOUSES TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE INSURANCE COVERAGE TO ITS PATRONS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, it is a declared policy of the City government to promote the welfare and well-being of the general public;

WHEREAS, this Ordinance seeks to provide an adequate and sufficient indemnity and/or financial protection and assistance to moviegoers who may sustain inquiries or die while inside a movie house during screening hours as a result of fire, earthquake, stampede or other accidents, whether or not the same is due to a fortuitous event;

WHEREAS, it is believed that it would be relatively easier for the victims-claimants to be paid promptly and equitable if the parties responsible and/or legally liable for the injuries are insured against liability to the public.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. All owners and/or operators of a movie house in Quezon City shall, upon the effectivity of this Ordinance, secure an insurance policy from a reputable insurance company providing for the following coverage to its patrons who may sustain injuries or die while inside the movie house during screening hours as a result of fire, earthquake, stampede or other accidents, whether or not the same is due to a fortuitous event, to wit:

For Death - P20,000.00 maximum for one (1) person For Physical Injuries - P10,000.00 maximum for one person

SECTION 2. Mayor's Permit to operate a movie house shall not be issued or renewed, unless the owner and/or operator thereof shall submit together with the original application or application for renewal a copy of the insurance policy issued by a reputable insurance company providing for the coverage required under Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 3. An owner and/or operator of a movie house who shall operate the same without the insurance coverage for its patrons as required under the provision of this ordinance shall be punished with a fine of not more than P5,000.00 or imprisonment of not more than six (6) months, or both, at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 4. If the offender is a corporation or a partnership, the penalty provided above shall be imposed upon the President and/or General Manager and managing Partner or General Manager, respectively.

SECTION 5. Any official or employee of the City government who shall issue or cause the issuance of a Mayor's Permit to any owner and/or operator of a movie house without the required insurance under the provision of this Ordinance shall suffer the penalties provided for in Section 3 hereof.
