AN ORDINANCE RENAMING ALLEY 19 TO R. BARTOLOME ALLEY OF BARANGAY PAG-ASA, DISTRICT I, QUEZON CITY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, streets, avenues, boulevards, parks, playgrounds, historical spots and other public places are so named as to signify and perpetuate the greatness and nobility of certain personage of note, or the significance of certain events;

WHEREAS, Section 13, paragraph b (2) of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that:

"The Sanggunians of highly urbanized cities and of component cities whose charters prohibits their voters from voting for provincial elected officials, hereinafter referred to in this Code as independent component cities, may in consultation with the Philippine Historical Commission, change the name of the following within its territorial jurisdiction:

1. xxxxxxxx
2. City roads, avenues, boulevards, thoroughfares, and bridges

WHEREAS, as mandated by the above-quoted provision of the Local Government Code, consultation were made with the National Historical Institution and said government agency interposed no objection to herein measure;

WHEREAS, during the Administration of the late Bartolome, he was able to establish the "Barrio Hall" or "Barangay Hall" located at Road 9 corner Road 11, making the then, Barrio Bagong Pag-asa, the first barrio in Quezon City to have its own official building;
