AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED PESOS (P100.00) FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS OF REGISTERING AND MONITORING AND TO REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF LOCAL BUSINESS TAXES ON THE BARANGAY MICRO BUSINESS ENTERPRISES.

WHEREAS, records of the Department of Trade and Industry show that of the 811,592 business enterprises officially registered therein, 743,949 or 91.9% thereof, are classified as micro business;

WHEREAS, to date, only 274 micro business enterprises are registered in Quezon City since the approval in November 13, 2002 of Republic Act No. 1978, otherwise known as "An Act To Promote The Establishment of Barangay Micro Business Enterprises (BMBE), Providing Incentives and Benefits Therefore, And For Other Purposes;"

WHEREAS, Section 4 of R.A. 1978 permissively provides, "The LGUs shall issue the Certificate of Authority promptly and free of charge, however, to defray the administrative costs of registering and monitoring the BMBEs, the LGUs may charge a fee not exceeding One Thousand Pesos;
