ORDINANCE NO. SP-**1628**, S-2005
(PO2005-189)

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL SCHOOLS WITHIN QUEZON CITY TO EDUCATE THE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AT LEAST ONCE EVERY QUARTER BASIC FIRST AID TREATMENT TO PROPERLY INSTRUCT THEM THE APPLICATION OF IMMEDIATE CURE TO INJURED PERSONS IN CASES OF EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, high school students are matured enough to discern the urgency of applying and performing first aid treatment to deter further injury to any individual requiring medical assistance;

WHEREAS, high school students should be properly educated on the application of first aid treatment so as to prepare them for any emergency that might arise anywhere and be able to help people who are in need;

WHEREAS, one of the primary aim of the local government of Quezon City is to protect its constituents by making the first aid treatment a general knowledge so that the people through the government's initiatives will gain information about first aid treatment;

WHEREAS, it will be beneficial to all teachers and high school students from Quezon City for they will gain knowledge in treating people in cases of emergencies and be able to serve the government and the people by adopting their basic skills in saving lives.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. All schools located within Quezon City, public or private, are hereby required to conduct a per year level training of first aid treatment starting from first year high school up to fourth year high school at least once every quarter

SECTION 2. The school administrators must coordinate with the Philippine National Red Cross or any licensed government agency that provides seminars in giving first aid treatment.


SECTION 3. Failure to comply with said ordinance will result to the imposition of a fine upon said school. Three Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00) for the first offense, and Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) for the second and subsequent offenses.

SECTION 4. Repealing Clause. All ordinances and local legislative enactments contrary to the provisions of this measure are hereby repealed or modified, accordingly.



   

SECTION 5. Effectivity clause. This measure shall take effect immediately upon its approval.


