ORDINANCE NO. SP- **2521**, S-2016

AN ORDINANCE EXPROPRIATING A PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED IN KAINGIN BUKID, BARANGAY APOLONIO SAMSON, QUEZON CITY, PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS LOT 4606-C-4, (LRC) PSD-95856, COVERED BY TRANSFER CERTIFICATE OF TITLE (TCT) NO. RT-102536 (135620), REGISTERED UNDER THE NAME OF TE SO SENG, COVERING AN AREA OF ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FORTY TWO (1,242) SQUARE METERS, MORE OR LESS, BEING PART OF A DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL TO CONVERT THE TWENTY FOUR THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED THREE (24,603) SQUARE METERS AREA (12 CONTIGUOUS LOTS) IN KAINGIN BUKID, INTO A SOCIALIZED HOUSING PROJECT FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE OCCUPANT INFORMAL SETTLER FAMILIES (ISFs).

WHEREAS, an enormous fire broke out last January 1, 2015 in Kaingin Bukid, Barangay Apolonio Samson area that razed and burned the houses and greatly displaced more than two thousand (2,000) families who belonged to the indigent and informal settlers;

WHEREAS, these families, whose dwellings were burned to the ground and left almost uninhabitable, relied and depended greatly on the assistance provided by the Local Government of Quezon City.
