ORDINANCE NO. SP- **2541**, S-2016

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A "QUEZON CITY SHELTER HOME FOR SENIOR CITIZENS" WHICH SHALL PROVIDE TEMPORARY SHELTER AND IMMEDIATE CARE FOR ABANDONED, NEGLECTED, VAGRANT, AND/OR HOMELESS SENIOR CITIZENS AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THERETO.

WHEREAS, Section 11, Article XIII of the Constitution provides that the State shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavour to make essential goods, health and other social services available to all the people at affordable cost. Section 4, Article XV of the Constitution further declares that it is the duty of the family to take care of its elderly members while the State may design programs of social security for them;
