ORDINANCE NO. SP- **2586**, S-2017

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE EXPANDED PARAMETERS FOR THE DECLARATION OF A DRUG-CLEARED BARANGAY, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government through the Quezon City Anti-Drug Abuse Advisory Council (QCADAAC) has exerted efforts for the eradication of illegal drugs in the City. The Quezon City Council, in recent years, approved several anti-illegal drug measures in adherence to a Drug-Free Quezon City.

WHEREAS, the Office of the President's Dangerous Drugs Board issued Board Resolution No. 2, Series of 2007 as amended by Board Resolution No. 2 Series of 2016 primarily to provide guidelines on the clearing of drug-affected barangays and implementation of drug clearing program at the Barangay level;

WHEREAS, in order to effectively implement the Barangay drug-clearing operations, there is a need to provide for the expanded parameters for the declaration of a drug-cleared status of a drug-affected barangay;

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WHEREAS, on December 20 and 28, 2016, consultative meetings were conducted to come up, discuss, articulate, establish and adopt parameters for the declaration of a drug-cleared status of a drug-affected barangay;

WHEREAS, the QCADAAC adopted the expanded parameters for declaring drug-cleared status of drug affected barangays in a special meeting presided by Quezon City Vice Mayor Ma. Josefina G. Belmonte, Chairperson QCADAAC.

NOW, THEREFORE,





BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. TITLE - This ordinance shall be known as the "Quezon City Expanded Parameters for Declaring Drug Cleared Barangay Ordinance".

SECTION 2. OBJECTIVE - The primary purpose of this Ordinance is to re-assess the current drug situation at the barangay level to effectively implement the barangay drug clearing program.

SECTION 3. CLASSIFICATION OF BARANGAY DRUG AFFECTATION - The following classification of barangays shall be observed in determining the priority areas for clearing operations:

3.1 Drug-Affected Barangay - has reported presence of drug user, pusher, manufacturer, marijuana cultivator, or other drug personality, drug den, marijuana plantation, clandestine drug laboratory, and facilities related to production of illegal drugs.

- a. Seriously Affected - reported presence of at least 1 clandestine drug laboratory or marijuana plantation in the community, reported presence of more than 20% of the barangay's total population are drug personalities and reported presence of 3 or more drug dens or "tiangges". For purposes of this ordinance, the term drug personalities shall mean drug users, pushers and financiers.
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- b. *Moderately Affected* - reported presence of 2% to 20% of the barangay's total population are drug personalities.
 - c. *Slightly Affected* - reported presence of less than 2% of total Barangay population are drug personalities.
- 3.2 *Drug-Cleared Barangay* - Classified as previously drug affected and subjected to drug-clearing operations and declared free from any illegal drug activities pursuant to the parameters set forth under Section 5 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. GENERAL SUPERVISION OF BARANGAY DRUG-CLEARING OPERATIONS - For purposes of effective monitoring of the implementation of Barangay drug-clearing operations, the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) Director General shall be the Officer Primarily Responsible (OPR) for providing the general supervision over the drug-clearing operations implementation. The Quezon City Police Department shall designate a secretariat that will collate reports and maintain periodic statistics on barangay drug-clearing operations for evaluation/analysis and continuing enhancement of processes and procedures.

SECTION 5. EXPANDED PARAMETERS FOR DECLARING DRUG-CLEARED STATUS OF DRUG-AFFECTED BARANGAYS -The following parameters shall be complied in order for a Barangay to be declared as drug cleared, to wit:

- 3.1 All 142 Barangays of Quezon City shall meet the following requirements:
- a. Non-availability of drug supply;
 - b. Absence of drug transit/transshipment activity;
 - c. Absence of clandestine drug laboratory;
 - d. Absence of clandestine drug warehouse;
 - e. Absence of clandestine chemical warehouse;
 - f. Absence of marijuana cultivation site;
 - g. Absence of drug den, dive or resort;
 - h. Absence of drug pusher;
 - i. Absence of drug user/dependent; and
 - j. Absence of protector/coddler and financier.

3.2 Existence of Barangay Anti-Drug Abuse Council (BADAC) which was revitalized through a DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2015-63.

- a. BADAC Action Plans
- b. Allocation of funds for anti-drug abuse programs, projects and activities
- c. Implementation of the Prevention Education Program

3.3 Existence of Ugnayan ng Barangay at mga Simbahan (UBAS)/Mamamayang Ayaw sa Anomalya, Mamamayang Ayaw sa Ilegal na Droga (MASA MASID)

- a. Presence of Ugnayan ng Barangay at mga Simbahan (UBAS)
- b. Presence of Mamamayang Ayaw sa Anomalya, Mamamayang Ayaw sa Ilegal na Droga (MASA MASID) Team
 - i. MASA MASID Action Plan/Implementation Plan to include plans/programs for drug abuse prevention and rehabilitation up to the Community Rehabilitation Program and funding requirement.
 - ii. Dedicated hotline for reporting and suggestion/reporting box solely for drug related reports.
 - iii. Neighborhood watch group for every cluster

SECTION 6. STEERING COMMITTEE - A steering committee shall be created to review, evaluate and validate all the necessary documents submitted by the barangays to the Department of the Interior and Local Government-Quezon City Field Office (DILG-QCFO) and the Quezon City Police Department (QCPD). The steering committee shall be composed of the following:

1. Chairperson of the City Anti-Drug Abuse Advisory Council;
2. City Director, DILG-QCFO; A



3. QCPD Director;
4. President of the Liga ng mga Barangay;
5. Director of Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA); and
6. Religious Sector Representative.

SECTION 7. PERIODICAL ASSESSMENT - A periodical assessment shall be conducted on drug-cleared barangays. The drug-cleared barangays shall ensure continuing compliance with the expanded parameters provided by this ordinance. Any barangay found not in continuing compliance thereto shall have the status as drug-cleared revoked.

SECTION 8. ANNUAL RECOGNITION OF DRUG CLEARED BARANGAY - The QCADAAC shall recognize the Drug Cleared Barangays during Flag Raising Activity at the Quezon City Hall or during the Barangay Assembly/Day event. Monetary reward and Plaque of Recognition shall also be provided to all Drug Cleared Barangays which shall be used for their anti-illegal drugs campaign.

SECTION 9. IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES - The QCADAAC, Quezon City Police District, Department of the Interior and Local Government-Quezon City Field Office, Quezon City Liga ng mga Barangay shall formulate and issue within ninety (90) days after the approval of this ordinance, the necessary implementing guidelines.

SECTION 10. APPROPRIATIONS - The Quezon City Government shall appropriate funds for barangay drug-clearing operations. The Quezon City Police Department shall submit an annual budget proposal for Barangay drug-clearing operations to the Local Chief Executive to form part of the executive budget of the City for appropriation by the Sangguniang Panlungsod. The QCADAAC shall also appropriate the necessary funds intended for the annual recognition.

SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE - If for any reason any section or provision of this ordinance is declared illegal or unconstitutional, other sections or provisions hereof shall continue to be in full force and effect. ✕

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SECTION 12. REPEALING CLAUSE - All ordinances, rules and regulations, and orders which are inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVITY - This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.
