ORDINANCE NO. SP- 2701 \_\_\_ S-2018

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CREATION OF QUEZON CITY PROTECTION CENTER FOR VICTIMS/SURVIVORS OF GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE AND ABUSE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 5, 6, 8 AND 15 OF ORDINANCE NO. SP-2191, S-2012.

WHEREAS. Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-2191, S-2012 was pussed in light of the reality that gender-based violence is not limited to any sex, gender, or age group. The Crisis Center for Buttered Women was expanded to cater to all victims of gender-based violence including women, children, and lesbians, gays, bisexuals, and transgenders (LGBTs), hence the creation of the Quezon City Protection Center for Victim-Survivors of Gender-Based Violence and Abuse (hereinafter referred to as the QC Protection Centern

WHEREAS, since its launch on December 2012, the protection center has successfully handled 964 cases by rendering protection services and various medical, legal, psychiatric/psychological support. police assistance, and social services to the victim-servicers, pairing the way to their recovery and reintegration to the supergr

WHEREAS, to better adhere to the QC Protection Center's objectives, there is a need to reinforce its organizational structure to further provide comprehensive service to the victim-survivors of gentler-based violence.

## NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. REORGANIZATION – The Quezon City Protection Center for Victims/Survivors of Gender-based Violence and Abuse shall be transferred to the supervision of the Office of the City Mayor to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance, thereby amending Section 6 of Ordinance No. SP-2191, S-2012.

SECTION 2. COMMITTEE ON GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE — The Committee on Gender-based Violence shall be created to oversee the management of the protection center and ensure that the provisions of this Ordinance are efficiently and effectively implemented for the benefit of the victim-survivors of gender-based tildence. It shall have the following duties and advocacies:

- in Formulate plans and policies to effectively address the needs of the victims/survivors of gender-based violence by providing a safe environment and facilitating recovery through medical, psychiatric/psychological, legal support, and social services;
- b) Approve management and policy guidelines of the services and programs of the Protection Center;
- c) Regularly monitor and evaluate the implementation of programs and projects of the center to ensure efficient service delivery; and
- d) Collaborate with other government agencies, nonyovernmental organizations (NGOs), people's organizations, and international institutions to forward the advocacies of the committee, raise awareness, and pool efforts to address the problem of gender-based violence.

SECTION 3. COMPOSITION OF THE COMMITTEE - The Committee on Gender-based Violence shall be composed of the following officials:

- OC Council Chairperson of the Committee on Women, Family Relations, and Gender Equality;
- 2) QC Council Chairperson of the Committee on Children
- d) Hospital Director, QC General Hospital;
- er The Head or his/her authorized representative from the City Health Department
- (i) The Head or his/her authorized representative from the Social Services Development Department
- g) The Head or his/her authorized representative from the Liga ng mga Barangay
- h) The Head or his/her authorized representative from the Quezon City Barangay Operations Center
- i) The Head of the Quezon City Council for the Protection of Children or his/her authorized representative;
- The Head or his/her authorized representative from the Gender and Development (GAD) Council;
- k) The Head or his/her authorized representative from the Quezon City Police Department (QCPD);
- The Head or his/her authorized representative from the City Legal Department; and
- m: Representative/s from the NGOs working on genderbased violence.

SECTION 4. CREATION OF UNITS – The protection center will be composed of five (5) units which shall have their respective roles:

- Administrative Support Unit This unit shall attend to the personnel and administrative needs of the Protection Center.
- b) Counseling and Case Intake Unit This unit shall be in charge of client's admission, case management, and after care services to be rendered by professional and experienced service providers.

- c) Medical Support Unit This unit shall be composed of medical professionals/medico-legal to examine, prescribe medication, and administer treatment to the clients of the Protection Center.
- di Legal and Security Unit This unit will provide legal consultations, assist in the judicial process, and ensure the safety of clients.
- ej Advocacy and Network Unit This unit shall develop programs for the promotion of the Center's services and advocacies by partnering with various NGOs, public, private, and international institutions. It shall develop trainings and modules for stakeholders and conduct relevant studies to be used by the Center.

SECTION 5. STAFFING PATTERN – To fulfill its functions, the protection center shall employ the following regular plantilla personnel whose positions and qualifications are based on signations of the policies of the Qualification, Standards of CSC M.C. No. 01. S-1997, thus amending Section 5 of Ordinance No. SP-2191. S-2012:

SECTION 6. The Police officer/s assigned to the Quezon City Protection. Center should be approved by the Philippine National Police – Quezon City Police District Director.

SECTION 7. MANUAL OF OPERATIONS – A Manual of Operations must be created following the enactment of this Ordinance to determine the specifics of the operation of the Protection Center. It must be submitted and subjected to the approval of the City Council six (6) months after the approval of this measure.

SECTION 8. FUNDING – The initial funding of Five Million Php5,000.000.00) shall be the budgetary requirements for the Quezon City Protection Center subject to the availability of funds. In the succeeding year, the said budget shall be included in the annual appropriation, thus amending Section 15 of Ordinance No. SP-2191. S-2012.

SECTION 9. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE – The provisions of this Crainance are separable. In the event that any of the provision/s are declared invalid by a competent court, the validity of all other provisions shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 10. REPEALING CLAUSE - Any ordinance executive order local issuance and regulations, or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this Ordinance, is hereby repealed and or modified, accordingly.

SECTION 11. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
