WHEREAS, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child which the Philippines signed and ratified recognizes that all children have the right to survival, development, protection, and participation;

WHEREAS, as recognized by The United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF), the challenge in education is not simply to get children into school, but also to improve the overall quality of schooling and address threats to participation;

WHEREAS, it is essential to address all elements that influence the well-being and rights of the child as a learner and the main beneficiary of teaching, while improving other school functions in the process;
