THROUGH THE QUEZON CITY DISASTER COORDINATING DIVISION, UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC ORDER AND SAFETY TO FORMULATE CONTINGENCY PLANS AND MEASURES AND BRING ABOUT A STATE OF AWARENESS AND VIGILANCE IN VIEW OF THE FEARSOME CONSEQUENCES THAT MAY RESULT FROM THE EL NIÑO PHENOMENON.

WHEREAS, this early, the Metropolitan Manila area is experiencing signs of the El Niño, characterized by the early onset of the dry season;

WHEREAS, El Niño phenomenon may result to drought, shortage of food, and lack of potable drinking water;

WHEREAS, there must be counter-measures and safeguards that should be adopted by the City government and the citizenry so as not to aggravate the dreadful and distressing conditions that scientist anticipate would ensure as a consequence of such phenomenon;

WHEREAS, it is imperative for the City government through the Quezon City Disaster Coordinating Division to immediately convene and formulate solutions, contingency plans and measures based on consensus and particular needs of each sector such as food-related projects, water conservation projects and priority setting and release of fund and resources.


