RESOLUTION NO. SP- 5053, S-2011

A RESOLUTION EXTENDING SINCEREST SYMPATHIES AND DEEPEST CONDOLENCES TO THE BEREAVED FAMILY OF THE LATE GENERAL ANGELO TOMAS REYES, FORMER CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES AND SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATIONAL DEFENSE, WHO DIED LAST FEBRUARY 8, 2011.

WHEREAS, the entire Filipino nation is presently mourning the sudden, untimely, shocking and tragic death of General Angelo Tomas Reyes who died last February 8, 2011;

WHEREAS, the people of Quezon City, through their City Mayor, Honorable Herbert M. Bautista, Vice Mayor, Honorable Joy Belmonte and representatives in the Quezon City Council, would like to join the nation in extending sincerest sympathies and deepest condolences to the bereaved members of his family;

WHEREAS, General Angelo Reyes, the illustrious son of the late spouses Pablo Reyes and Purification Tomas of Binangonan, Rizal, was born on March 17, 1945 in San Miguel, Manila, and died at the ripe age of 66 years after serving in the public service for 45 years. His military career started when he entered the Philippine Military Academy where he graduated as one of the top ten (10) of his class in 1966, and reached the top of the military hierarchy which he served as Chief of Staff and Secretary of the Department of National Defense;

WHEREAS, General Reyes worked towards the "Vision of a 21st Century Armed Forces that is fully mission-effective, progressively-efficient, technology-driven, versatile and responsive to change, and composed of soldiers who are role models to the Filipino people". He crafted the National Internal Security Plan addressing the root causes of insurgency through poverty alleviation, delivery of basic services and empowerment of local government.

WHEREAS, his formal education included the degrees of Master in Business Administration and Master in Public Administration which he obtained from prestigious schools both here and abroad. He was the recipient of various prestigious awards and citations in recognition of his public services, including the "Order of the White Elephant" given by the King of Thailand, and the "Order of Valor" given by the King of Malaysia";

WHEREAS, the Filipino people are deeply grateful to General Angelo Tomas Reyes who devoted and dedicated his entire life to the service of the Republic. They find it rather difficult to believe and accept the death of the good General.


NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to extend, as it does hereby extend sincerest sympathies and deepest condolences to the bereaved family of the late GENERAL ANGELO TOMAS REYES, former Chief of Staff of the Armed Forces of the Philippines and Secretary of the Department of National Defense, who died last February 8, 2011.


