RESOLUTION NO. SP- 5174, S-2011.

A RESOLUTION STRONGLY RECOMMENDING TO THE CONGRESS THE ENACTMENT OF A LAW WHICH WILL MAKE IT A CRIME AND PUNISHABLE OFFENSE FOR HABITUAL NUISANCE CANDIDATES WHO REPEATEDLY FILE CERTIFICATES OF CANDIDACY AT ALMOST EVERY NATIONAL ELECTION EVEN WHEN IT IS OBVIOUS THAT THEY DO NOT HAVE THE FINANCIAL RESOURCES, ORGANIZATIONAL NETWORK AND OTHER MEANS NECESSARY TO BE ABLE TO SERIOUSLY WAGE OR CONDUCT A NATIONWIDE CAMPAIGN TO WIN THE ELECTION.

WHEREAS, there are nuisance candidates who have made it their habit to file certificates of candidacy at almost every national election even when it is obvious that they do not have the financial resources, organizational network and other means necessary for them to be able to seriously wage or conduct a nationwide campaign in order to win in the election;

WHEREAS, the filing of said nuisance certificates of candidacy is a big drain on the financial and other resources of the Commission on Election, and constitutes as additional burden on said agency in looking into and attending to said candidates;

WHEREAS, there is a felt need to stop or discourage the filing of said nuisance certificates of candidacy. }

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to recommend, as it does hereby strongly recommend to the Congress the enactment of a law which will make it a crime and punishable offense for habitual nuisance candidates who file their certificates of candidacy at almost every national election even when it is obvious that they do not have the financial resources, organizational network and other means necessary for them to be able to seriously wage or conduct a nationwide campaign in the election.
