RESOLUTION NO. SP- 5366, S-2011

A RESOLUTION STRONGLY URGING THE BUSINESS PERMITS AND LICENSING OFFICE (BPLO) AND THE DEPARTMENT OF BUILDING OFFICIAL STRICT COMPLIANCE OF ORDINANCE NO. SP-115, S-93, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 48, S-88, PROVIDING PREFERENTIAL RIGHTS TO REGISTERED VOTERS OF QUEZON CITY TO BE EMPLOYED AND HIRED IN INFRASTRUCTURE, CONSTRUCTIONS AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS IN QUEZON CITY, BY LIMITING SAID PREFERENTIAL RIGHTS TO REGISTERED VOTERS AND BONAFIDE RESIDENTS OF THE BARANGAYS WHERE SUCH CONSTRUCTION OR BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT ARE LOCATED.

WHEREAS, Section 458 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, empowers the Sangguniang Panlungsod to approve resolutions for the general welfare of the city and its inhabitants in relation to Section 16 of the Code;

WHEREAS, as per report of the Anti-Poverty Integration Task Force, measuring poverty is necessary as it provides policy makers with a description of the pattern of poverty in their society, and facilitates the development of targeted and resource efficient interventions;

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WHEREAS, the strict enforcement of Ordinance No. SP-115, S-93 would ensure that Quezon City residents will be given better opportunities of securing jobs here in Quezon City, thus resulting to the reduction of unemployment and the number of households living in extreme poverty;

WHEREAS, a copy of this resolution shall be furnished to be posted in conspicuous places within every barangay hall, as well as all business establishments within the territorial jurisdiction of Quezon City, to notify the public.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby strongly urge the Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO) and the Department of Building Official strict compliance of Ordinance No. SP-115, S-93, otherwise known as "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 48, S-88, providing preferential rights to Registered Voters of Quezon City to be employed and hired in Infrastructure, Constructions and Business establishments in Quezon City, by limiting said preferential rights to Registered Voters and Bonafide Residents of the Barangays where such construction or business establishment are located.
