RESOLUTION NO. SP- 5846, S-2014,

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR, HONORABLE HERBERT M. BAUTISTA, TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, DIVISION OF QUEZON CITY (DEPED-QC), REPRESENTED BY ITS SCHOOLS DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT DR. PONCIANO A. MENGUITO, AND TEACH FOR THE PHILIPPINES, INCORPORATED (TFP) REPRESENTED BY ITS CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER MS. MARGARITA L. DELGADO, FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF TFP'S PROJECT WHICH AIMS TO AID IN THE TRANSITION OF K TO 12 EDUCATION PROGRAM IN TEN (10) MOST UNDER-SERVED PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN QUEZON CITY AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AS THE COUNTERPART FUND/SHARE OF THE CITY TO BE TAKEN FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CITY MAYOR.

WHEREAS, Teach for the Philippines, Inc. (TFP), a non-stock, non-profit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, is focused on bridging the education gap in the Philippines by advocating functional literacy and progressive teacher and administrator training. The pilot initiative is designed to recruit, select, train and provide on-going professional development to young individuals committed to closing the achievement gap by serving as "Fellows" in under-resourced school systems;

WHEREAS, the Department of Education, Quezon City Division of City Schools (DepEd-QC) and the Quezon City Government recognize the lack of public school teachers and welcome the implementation of the Teach for the Philippines (TFP) program to provide "Fellows" in under-served Quezon City public schools;

AS *D* *S*

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government and DepEd-QC, in collaboration with TFP, have selected and designated the public elementary schools wherein the participants recruited and selected by TFP will be placed as "Fellows". A Partner School is one which is considered part of the Depressed Disadvantaged Underserved (DDU) list of the DepEd and is considered high-need by the Quezon City Government;

WHEREAS, as the pilot program of TFP, fifty-two (52) "Fellows" have been selected after a rigorous screening process and intensive education training to serve as public school teachers for the school years 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 in public schools which are considered depressed disadvantaged underserved;

WHEREAS, TFP's "Fellows" are trained to teach the Department of Education's K+12 and Mother Tongue Based Education Curriculums ahead of the nationwide implementation schedule. As a five-year pilot, TFP Fellows can aid the Department of Education in the research and design for the new curriculums. Likewise, it could help DepEd in the revisions and design of the final iterations of K + 12 and MBELS;

WHEREAS, as partners of TFP and DepEd-QC, the Quezon City Government shall allocate the budget from the Office of the City Mayor to defray portion of the allowances of the TFP Fellows as counterpart fund/share of the City to sustain the program in ten (10) most under-served public schools in Quezon City for the School Year (SY) 2014-2015;

WHEREAS, the proposed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) shall form an integral part of this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to authorize, as it does hereby authorize the City Mayor, Honorable Herbert M. Bautista, to enter into a Memorandum Of Agreement (MOA) with the Department of Education, Division of Quezon City (DEPED-QC) represented by its Schools Division Superintendent Dr. Ponciano A. Menguito and Teach for the Philippines, Incorporated (TFP), represented by its Chief Executive Officer Ms. Margarita L. Delgado, for the implementation of TFP's project which aims to aid in the transition of K to 12 Education Program in ten (10) most under-served public schools in Quezon City and appropriating funds therefor as the counterpart fund/share of the city to be taken from the Office of the City Mayor.)

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


