A RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE SINCEREST CONGRATULATIONS AND COMMENDATION OF MAYOR HERBERT M. BAUTISTA, VICE MAYOR MA. JOSEFINA G. BELMONTE AND THE MEMBERS OF THE QUEZON CITY COUNCIL TO HIDILYN DIAZ FOR WINNING THE SILVER MEDAL IN THE WOMEN'S 53KG WEIGHTLIFTING EVENT IN RIO DE JANEIRO, BRAZIL AND FOR BEING THE FIRST FILIPINA TO EARN AN OLYMPIC MEDAL.

WHEREAS, the 2016 Olympics is a major international multi-sport event in the tradition of the Olympic Games as governed by the International Olympic Committee;

WHEREAS, the following thirteen (13) Filipino athletes represented the Philippines in the 2016 Olympics namely: table tennis player Ian Lariba, boxers Rogen Ladon and Charly Suarez, swimmers Jasmine Alkhaldi and Jessie Lacuna, track and field athletes Eric Cray, Marestella Torres-Sunang and Mary Joy Tabal, weightlifters Hidilyn Diaz and Nestor Colonia, judoka Kodo Nakano, taekwondo jin Kirstie Alora, and golfer Miguel Tabuena;

WHEREAS, Hidilyn Diaz recorded a total weight of 200kg, just behind the 212kg of gold medalist Hsu Shu-ching of Chinese Taipei, winning for the Philippines the silver medal in the women's 53kg weightlifting event;


WHEREAS, Ms. Diaz is the first Filipino to win an Olympic medal since 1996, the first non-boxer to win a medal for the country since 1936, the first Olympic medalist from Mindanao, and the first Filipina to earn an Olympic Medal;

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper for the City government to recognize and commend the relentless hardwork and determination of our Filipino athletes who bring honor to the country.


NOW, THEREFORE,


