A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT, REPRESENTED BY MAYOR HERBERT M. BAUTISTA, TO ENTER AND SIGN A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH THE TEACH FOR THE PHILIPPINES INC., (TFP) AND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, DIVISION OF QUEZON CITY FOR SY 2017-2018 AND SY 2018-2019, SUBJECT TO EXISTING LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The initiative is designed to recruit, select, train and provide on-going professional development to young individuals committed to closing the achievement gap by serving as Fellows in under-resourced school systems.

WHEREAS, the TFP, in the accomplishment of its mission, needs the support of the various sectors of society to include other agencies, government officials, and local government units;


WHEREAS, tripartite agreements have been signed by the Quezon City Government, Department of Education, Division of Quezon City and Teach for the Philippines for the implementation of the latter's program for the School Years 2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015-2016, and 2016-2017;

WHEREAS, throughout the years, TFP have provided our public schools with invaluable insights on the importance of character building, literacy and community engagement;

WHEREAS, to continue this valued program, it is a necessity that a Memorandum of Agreement be executed and entered into between Quezon City through Mayor Herbert M. Bautista, the Department of Education, Division of Quezon City through Dr. Elizabeth E. Quesada, Schools Division Superintendent and the Teach for the Philippines through Clarissa Isabelle L. Delgado, Chief Executive Officer, to show that the parties have accepted and mutually agreed in the Terms and Conditions set forth under the Memorandum of Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE,




