A RESOLUTION URGING THE CITY GOVERNMENT IN COORDINATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION QUEZON CITY SCHOOLS DIVISION OFFICE TO INSTITUTE PROVISIONS UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9165, ALSO KNOWN AS THE "COMPREHENSIVE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT OF 2002" IN QUEZON CITY PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State to safeguard the integrity of its territory and the well-being of its citizenry particularly the youth, from the harmful effects of dangerous drugs on their physical and mental well-being, and to defend the same against acts or omissions detrimental to their development and preservation xxx the State needs to enhance further the efficacy of the law against dangerous drugs;

WHEREAS, Section 42, Article IV of Republic Act No. 9165 mandates that "all Elementary, Secondary, and Tertiary schools' student councils and campus organizations shall include in their activities a program for the prevention of and deterrence in the use of dangerous drugs, and referral for treatment and rehabilitation of students for drug dependence; *

NOW, THEREFORE,


