A RESOLUTION URGING THE CITY MAYOR, HONORABLE HERBERT M. BAUTISTA, TO PURCHASE DISASTER PRIMERS AND MANUALS, DISASTER KITS AND GO BAGS CONTAINING VARIOUS ESSENTIAL MATERIALS NECESSARY IN CASE OF DISASTER TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO THE RESIDENTS OF QUEZON CITY PARTICULARLY THE VULNERABLE AND LESS FORTUNATE RESIDENTS OF THE CITY.

WHEREAS, Section 458 (a)(1)(iv) of Republic Act No. 7610, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides for the City's power to enact ordinances to promote the general welfare and provide for the basic services and facilities to their constituents, to wit: *γ*

iv. "Adopt measures to protect the inhabitants of the City from the harmful effects of man-made or natural disasters and calamities, and to provide relief services and assistance for victims during and in the aftermath of said disasters or calamities and in their return to productive livelihood following said events";

WHEREAS, the City adopts a disaster risk reduction and management approach that is holistic, comprehensive, integrated and proactive in lessening the socio economic and environmental impact of disasters including climate change, and promote the involvement and participation of all sectors and all stakeholders concerned at all levels;

WHEREAS, the City should develop and strengthen the capacities of marginalized groups to mitigate, prepare for, respond to and recover from the effects of disasters;

WHEREAS, the City should equip its constituents with knowledge and skills on how to deal with disaster, and with equal importance, to prepare them to post disaster scenarios;

WHEREAS, the City should provide life preservation and meet the basic subsistence needs of the affected population based on acceptable standards during or immediately after a disaster;

WHEREAS, no matter what type of disaster strikes, it is vital to be prepared with right knowledge and equipment necessary to keep families safe, fed and hydrated in order to survive a natural or man-made disaster;

WHEREAS, disaster preparedness supplies which includes basic medical first aid kit, hygiene kits, pre-packed meals, instruments, and other necessary things should be pre packed and on hand so that it can be easily and quickly grabbed if a disaster strikes;

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
NOW, THEREFORE,
