A RESOLUTION URGING THE CITY MAYOR, HONORABLE HERBERT M. BAUTISTA, TO PURCHASE T-SHIRTS TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO THE TRICYCLE OPERATORS AND DRIVERS ASSOCIATIONS (TODA) OFFICERS AND MEMBERS TO SUPPORT THE QUEZON CITY'S ANTI-COLORUM DRIVE.

WHEREAS, there is a large number of unauthorized or "colorum" motorized tricycles plying the various routes in the City.

WHEREAS, the City should provide for assurance to its constituents that the services of the TODA that they are using is legitimate, and this could be done through proper uniforms to be distributed to TODAs;


WHEREAS, TODA officers and members, on the other hand, are considered as one of the vulnerable sectors of our society and majority of the City's constituents uses their services for transportation;


NOW, THEREFORE,


