AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. NC-85, S-1989, (QUEZON CITY LIQUOR ORDINANCE), ORDINANCE NO. SP-896, S-2000 AND ORDINANCE NO. SP-1452, S-2004 WHICH AMENDED PROVISIONS OF SP-91, S-1993, (QUEZON CITY REVENUE CODE) SO AS TO EFFECTIVELY REGULATE THE SALE, SERVING AND THE CONSUMPTION OF LIQUOR WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF QUEZON CITY.

Introduced by Councilors ALLAN BENEDICT S. REYES and JESUS MANUEL C. SUNTAY.

WHEREAS, several ordinances were enacted to regulate the sale, serving, dispensing and consumption of intoxicating liquor or alcohol beverages, beer and wine resulted to confusion in the proper implementation thereof;

WHEREAS, the uncontrolled disposal of liquor or intoxicating beverages within the prohibited time has contributed immensely to the alarming incidence of juvenile delinquency and criminality in the City including drunk driving;

WHEREAS, the baneful effect of drunkenness during the unholy hours of the night, if not effectively checked would disrupt the morals, undermine public order and the stability of the State;

WHEREAS, previous related ordinances show that all licensed liquor dealers are authorized to sell or serve liquor from 8:00AM until 10:00PM only, however, Special Permits are being granted to qualified establishments allowing the sale and serving of liquor past 10:00PM but not beyond 2:00AM;

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. SP-896, S-2000 was enacted by the City Council on 25 April 2000 and subsequently approved by the City Mayor on 23 May 2000 which specifically provided that qualified amusement places like bars, night clubs, cocktail lounges and the like are authorized through Special Permits to serve/dispense liquor beyond 10:00PM until 3:00AM the following day for an annual fee of Four Thousand Pesos (P4,000.00) thereby extending the time limit to another hour as originally provided for under Ordinance No. NC-85, Series of 1989;

WHEREAS, police and media reports have indicated that most vehicular and other traffic accidents and crimes occur during the hours of 2:00AM to 5:00AM;

WHEREAS, most street fighting/melee among youths, molestations and disturbances in the residential areas and subdivisions occur due to roadside drinking sessions.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. – Section 17 of Ordinance No. NC-85, Series of 1989, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“SECTION 17. Drinking Liquor in Public Places, Prohibited – The drinking of intoxicating liquor or alcoholic beverages including beer and local wine such as tuba, basi and the like in any public street, sidewalk, avenue, thoroughfare, park or plaza as well as drinking in roadsides or in city streets at any time of the day or night is hereby prohibited. Provided, however, that said prohibition shall not apply to private health resorts or parks duly licensed as such.

It shall be unlawful for any person to be drunk or intoxicated while in any public place or places open to public view, as well as to behave in a drunken, boisterous, rude or indecent manner to the annoyance and inconvenience of another person including those while driving any motor vehicle including motorcycle.”

SECTION 2. Section 6 of Ordinance No. SP-1452, Series of 2004 and Section 3 of Ordinance No. 896, S-2000 are hereby amended accordingly to read as follows:

“SECTION 88. Special Permit for the Selling/Serving Liquor During Prohibited Time – No licensed liquor dealer shall sell or serve liquor before 8:00a.m., and after 10:00p.m., except for sari-sari stores allowed only from 8:00a.m., to 6:00p.m. However, Special Permit may be issued upon payment of an annual fee in the amount of Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) for a qualified establishment other than amusement places shall be allowed to sell liquor from 10:00p.m., but not beyond 12:00 Midnight. Special Permits may be issued to qualified Amusement Places like bars, nightclubs, cocktail lounges, and the like to serve/dispense liquor from 10:00p.m., but not beyond 2:00a.m., only upon payment of Four Thousand Pesos (P4,000.00) per annum.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, buy, or otherwise dispense of any kind of hard drinks or liquor from any sari-sari store within the territorial jurisdiction of Quezon City from 6:00p.m., to 8:00a.m.

SECTION 3. Enforcement – the provisions of this Ordinance shall be properly and jointly enforced by the Quezon City Police District (QCPD), the Department of Public Order and Safety (DPOS), the Liquor Licensing and Regulatory Board (LLRB), the Business Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO) and all concerned Barangays of Quezon City.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET NO 1, GENERAL FUND BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2013, IN THE SUM OF ONE BILLION PESOS (P1,000,000,000.00) TO FUND THE VARIOUS INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMS OF THE CITY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Ordinance No SP-2175, S-2012 approved the Budget of the Quezon City Government in the total amount of (P12,000,003,700.00) to fund the expenditures of the City Government for Fiscal Year 2013;

WHEREAS, there is a need to appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of One Billion Pesos to fund and complete various infrastructure programs and projects of the Quezon City Government;

WHEREAS, the local finance committee attest that the surplus amount of One Billion Pesos is available in the coffers of the Quezon City Government to support various public expenses;

WHEREAS, the said funds is sufficient to finance the construction of public infrastructure essential to address the needs of the residents of Quezon City.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION – The amount of One Billion Pesos (P1,000,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated, as integral part of the General Fund Budget of the Quezon City Government for Fiscal Year 2013 by way of Supplemental Budget No 1, to finance various infrastructure programs and expenditures of the Quezon City Government.

SECTION 2. EXPENDITURES – The appropriated amount of One Billion Pesos (P1,000,000,000.00) in accordance with specific items of expenditures is hereby broken down as follows:
