ORDINANCE

INCREASING THE MONTHLY COMMUTABLE ALLOWANCE OF THE ONE HUNDRED TEN (110) QUEZON CITY BARANGAY NUTRITION SCHOLARS (CBSNS) FROM FOUR HUNDRED PESOS (P400.00) TO SIX HUNDRED PESOS (P600.00) FROM JANUARY 1, 1989 to DECEMBER 31, 1989 AND APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED SIXTY-FOUR THOUSAND PESOS (P264,000.00) FROM ANY AVAILABLE FUNDS OF THE CITY TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE.

WHEREAS, malnutrition has become prevalent in the Philippines and claiming thousands of lives of children;

WHEREAS, the magnitude of the malnutrition problem in the country urgently needs greater involvement and participation of nutritionists to serve directly those in the grassroot level;

WHEREAS, to alleviate this problem, Presidential Decree No. 1569 entitled "Strengthening the barangay Nutrition Program by Providing for a Barangay Nutrition Scholar in every Barangay" was signed into law on June 11, 1978;

WHEREAS, in consonance with the spirit envisioned under PD 1569, the Quezon City Barangay Nutrition Scholars was constituted by the Quezon City Government, to be primarily responsible for delivering nutrition services and other related activities such as community health, backyard food production, environmental sanitation, natal feeding and family planning in different Barangays most especially in the depressed areas;
