WHEREAS, in 1954 the Social Welfare Services Division originated as a local branch of the Social Welfare Administration (new the Department of Social Welfare) and relied on the latter for technical assistance and coordination for the dissemination of social services;

WHEREAS, in 1957 the operational expenses and salaries of the office personnel was wholly funded by the Queson City Government;

WHEREAS, in 1972 the Social Welfare Services Division adopted a program aimed at self-sufficiency and socio-economic uplifment wherein social welfare now encompasses a wider range of services catering to more disadvantaged groups;

WHEREAS, the services include Family Enrichment Programs, Community Welfare Programs, the Livelihood Programs, the Helave Youth Home and the Reception and Action Center for Youth Offenders and Medicants;
