ORDINANCE Numbered 158

Sec Ordinance
No. 37, re. 8, & No. 25

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF
LARGE CATTLE AND OTHER DOMESTIC ANIMALS IN
THE STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES IN QUEZON CITY
AND PROVIDING FOR A REWARD TO ANY PRIVATE
INDIVIDUAL WHO FINDS AND CATCHES ANY SUCH
ANIMAL.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Quezon City,
that:

SECTION 1. Scope of terms.- "Large cattle" as
herein used includes horse, mule, ass, carabao, cow
or any other domestic member of the bovine family.
The term "running at large" shall be understood to
mean ~~an~~ animal which is loose, unrestrained, uncon-
fined, or not under complete control of its owner or
the one in possession thereof.

SEC. 2. Running at large prohibited.- It shall
be unlawful for any person to permit or allow or cause
to be permitted or allowed the running at large of any
large cattle, hogs, goats and sheeps in any street or
public place in Quezon City.

SEC. 3. Compensation or reward.- Any private per-
son who shall find and catch any of the animals described
in the preceding section running at large in any street
or public place in Quezon City shall, upon bringing the
same immediately to the premises of the City Hall, be
entitled to receive as reward or compensation the amount
of P1.00 for every large cattle and P0.50 for every hog,
goat, or sheep thus found and caught.

SEC. 4. Redemption.- The owners of hogs, goats and
sheeps caught running at large in the streets and public
places in Quezon City may redeem them within a period of
three (3) days from the dates said animals were delivered
to the city authorities upon payment of the impounding
fee, maintenance and other expenses including the reward
or compensation given to the finder.

SEC. 5. Manner of disposal.- All large cattle
caught under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be
disposed of in accordance with the general law. The
hogs, goats and sheeps shall be delivered thru the
Police Department to the City Treasurer or his duly
authorized representative who shall dispose of the
same in accordance with the provisions of Section 8
of City Ordinance No. 32, *Ordinance No. 25K*

SEC. 6. Appropriation.- The sum of two hundred
pesos is hereby appropriated out of the unappropriated
funds of the city to cover the expenses to be incurred

in connection with the enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance.

SEC. 7. Penalty.- Any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$25.00 or by imprisonment for not more than one (1) month or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

SEC. 8. Repealing clause.- All ordinances or parts thereof which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 9. Effectivity.- This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
