ORDINANCE NO. SP- 2862, S-2019

AN ORDINANCE ACCREDITING THE ONE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED NINETY-THREE (1,693) NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS (NGOs), PEOPLE'S ORGANIZATIONS (POs) AND OTHER CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7160, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991, AND ITS IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS, IN RELATION TO MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2019-72 OF THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DILG).

WHEREAS, Section 34 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that local government units shall promote the establishment and operations of Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and People's Organizations (POs) to become partners in the pursuit of local economy;

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WHEREAS, Article 62, Rule XIII of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Local Government Code of 1991 (Republic Act No. 7160) mandates local government units to promote the establishment and operation of people's organizations, non-governmental organizations, and the private sector, to make them active partners in the pursuit of local autonomy, and to directly involve them in the plans, programs, projects or activities of the local government unit, such as, but not limited to, membership in local special bodies (LSBs) and involvement in the delivery of basic services and facilities;

WHEREAS, relative to the said Code and its IRR, Ordinance No. SP-23, S-92 was enacted creating the NGO and PO Accreditation Committee to process the applications for accreditation of NGOs and POs;

WHEREAS, these One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-Three (1,693) NGOs and POs have applied for accreditation with the Quezon City Council, through the Barangay and Community Relations Department (BCRD);

WHEREAS, the said applications were processed and evaluated by the NGO and PO Accreditation Committee and favorably recommended to the Quezon City Council for accreditation.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. The One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-Three (1,693) Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), People's Organizations (POs) and other Civil Society Organizations are hereby accredited pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), in relation to DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2019-72.

SECTION 2. The One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-Three (1,693) accredited organizations shall inform, within thirty (30) days from the approval of this Ordinance, the Quezon City Council, through the Office of the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod (OSSP), copy furnished the Barangay and Community Relations Department (BCRD), of any major changes in their organization, particularly with respect to their officers and office address.


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SECTION 3. The Quezon City Government, through the OSSP and in coordination with the BCRD, shall prepare and issue Certificate of Accreditation to the herein accredited organizations, duly signed by the City Mayor, the City Vice Mayor and the Chairperson of the NGO and PO Accreditation Committee and attested by the Secretary to the Sanggunian.

SECTION 4. The Official List of the said one thousand six hundred ninety-three organizations shall form an integral part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.
