ORDINANCE NO. SP- 882 . S-2000

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING TRUCKS AND OTHER HEAVY VEHICLES WITH A GROSS CAPACITY WERIGHT OF FOUR THOUSAND (4,000) KILOGRAMS FROM ENTERING OR PASSING ALONG BIGNAY, PAJO AND CHICO STREETS, LOCATED IN BARANGAY QUIRINO 2-A, DISTRICT III, QUEZON CITY, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS, as provided for in Section 391 (1) of RA 7160, the Sangguniang Barangay may enact ordinances as may be necessary to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants therein;

WHEREAS, Bignay, Pajo and Chico Streets found in Barangay Quirino 2-A, at present, are being used as alternate routes by motorists in gaining access to C-5 Road;

WHEREAS, vehicles traversing these secondary streets include heavy vehicles such as delivery trucks, container vans, lorries and sometimes tractors;

WHEREAS, these vehicles, considering their sizes and tonnage, pose great threat to the safety of residents within the area once an accident befell to any of these potential harbinger of dangers;

WHEREAS, with such constant use, this will result in the untimely deterioration of road condition of said barangay.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1 Title.- This ordinance shall be known as "THE TRAFFIC REGULATORY ORDINANCE OF BARANGAY QUIRINO 2-A."

SECTION 2. Definition of Terms.-

- a. "Heavy Vehicles" shall mean cargo trucks, containerized vans, lorries, tractors, tankers and the likes whether loaded or empty and having a gross capacity weight of more than 4,000 kilograms.
