WHEREAS, Don Alejandro Roces, Sr. Vocational High School, thru its Principal, has requested that the school be converted into Don Alejandro Roces, Sr., Science and Technology High School;

WHEREAS, establishing a Science and Technology School in Quezon City is in time with the city's goal of producing globally competitive, self-reliant and productive citizens who can contribute to the socio-economic well-being of the community;

WHEREAS, while the Regional Science Schools, Learning Resource Centers and Science and Technology Oriented Schools cater to intellectually gifted students, are tocused on knowledge of pure sciences, and aim to prepare students for a career in the sciences, a Science and Technology School will cater to the average group who may or may not proceed to college.

WHEREAS, Don Alejandro Roces, Sr. Science and Technology High School will implement a special curriculum that will provide appropriate background in science and technology to students to enable them to apply knowledge, skills and attitude learned in school into businesses and industries, consequently preparing them to the world of work

WHEREAS, Don Alejandro Roces St. Vocational High School has been offering during the school year 1999 2000 a science and technology emiched curriculum with the approval of the Department of Education, Culture and Sports to three (3) sections of the one hundred forty five (115) first year students;

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
