AN ORDINANCE RENAMING THAT PORTION OF SCOUT ALBANO STREET FROM THE CORNER OF MOTHER IGNACIA STREET UP TO EPIFANIO DE LOS SANTOS AVENUE (EDSA) AS EUGENIO LOPEZ STREET.


