AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF TOMAS MORATO AVENUE, FROM SCOUT ALBANO TO SCOUT BORROMEO, QUEZON CITY, FROM 4:00 P.M. OF OCTOBER 26, 2001, THROUGH 2:00 A.M. OF OCTOBER 27, 2001, IN OBSERVANCE OF THE 62ND FOUNDING ANNIVERSARY OF QUEZON CITY.

WHEREAS, Quezon City will celebrate its 62nd Founding Anniversary on October 12, 2001;

WHEREAS, the event is an opportunity for the people of Quezon City to showcase their innate hospitability, as well as their warm and friendly nature to the rest of the Philippines, and perhaps to the whole world;

WHEREAS, the temporary closure of Tomas Morato Avenue, from Scout Albanto Scout Borromeo on October 26, 2001, 4:00 p.m., through October 27, 2001, 2:00 a.m. is intended to allow and authorize business establishments operating therein to set-up are establish stalls, kiosks, booths, and stands along said street, on October 26, 2001;

WHEREAS, this ordinance also enjoins business establishments operating along Tomas Morato Avenue and along E. Rodriguez Avenue Extension, Libis, to offer a twenty percent (20%) discount on all food and drinks to the public to entice a greater number of people to participate in the festivities, thereby ensuring the success of the event;

WHEREAS, by temporarily closing Tomas Morato Avenue, from Scout Albano to Scout Borromeo, Quezon City, to vehicular traffic, from 4:00 p.m. of October 26 to 2:00 a.m. of the next day, October 27, 2001, the City government of Quezon City is providing for the institutionalization of an annual celebration that has the potential of becoming a tourist attraction, from which revenues may be derived by the City.
