ORDINANCE NO. SP-1183, S-2002

AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING AND IMPLEMENTING A MANAGEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR BARANGAY OFFICIALS, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER RELATED PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of 1991 has introduced various reforms for implementation in the local government level and has also provided a system of decentralization for proper governance;

WHEREAS, all elected barangay officials being self-reliant and self-improved public officials must formulate their own development training and capability-building policies which will serve as guide in the implementation of their programs and policies both in the administrative and legislative level;

WHEREAS, this relevant training and development skills would help them develop, as well as recognize the specific and vital needs of their barangay within an integrated approach;

WHEREAS, the Barangay Captains and the Barangay Kagawads being the acknowledged leaders in the community are the focal point of development in their respective areas of jurisdiction and having been equipped with such basic knowledge and skills can easily produce development and progress to their barangay;

WHEREAS, the economic, political and socio-cultural dimensions must be enhanced to make them effective providers of public service, otherwise the intention of the framers of the Local Government Code to make the Barangay an effective partner of the national government in nation-building can go to naught.
