AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT RETIRED EMPLOYEES DEATH BENEFIT RESERVE FUND, APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION PESOS (P1,000,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.
