ORDINANCE NO. SP- 1292, S-2003

AN ORDINANCE RENAMING BAYANI STREET, BARANGAY DOÑA IMELDA, QUEZON CITY, TO GUILLERMO C. ALTUNA STREET.

ABESAMIS, VOLTAIRE GODOFREDO L. LIBAN III, RAMON P. MEDALLA, ERIC Z. MEDINA, MARY ANN L. SUSANO, JORGE L. BANAL and DANTE M. DE GUZMAN.

WHEREAS, streets, avenues, boulevards, parks, playgrounds, historical spots, and other places are so named to signify and perpetuate the nobility of certain personages of note, or the significance of certain events;

WHEREAS, among his notable achievements, the late Quezon City Councilor Guillermo C. Altuna was the founder and concurrently the first national chairman of the 18,000-strong Philippine Councilors' League, a much coveted position which he continuously held undefeated during his three consecutive terms from 1988 until his untimely death on October 8, 1996, a feat of national impact which distinctly typifies the exceptional ability and dynamic leadership of Quezon City Councilor for that matter;

WHEREAS, in order to extol and perpetuate his name, virtue and achievements as an exemplary local legislator of Quezon City, it is most befitting to use the name of the late Councilor Guillermo C. Altuna on a street in Quezon City, particularly in Barangay Doña Imelda, where motorists and pedestrians passing through from different parts of the country will remember him:

WHEREAS, Bayani Street is located within the perimeter of the Barangay Hall Compound of Barangay Doña Imelda, the center of the defunct sub-city Mabuhay wherein for quite a time he concurrently and devotedly served as Deputy Mayor of seven (7) barangays in District IV during the incumbency of former Quezon City Mayor Brigido R. Simon, Jr.;
