ORDINANCE NO. SP-**1368**, S^h-2004

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE DEADLINE FOR THE PAYMENT OF BUSINESS TAXES AND FEES FROM JANUARY 20, 2004 TO JANUARY 31, 2004.

WHEREAS, in view of the limitations of the existing manpower and facilities of the City Treasury to accommodate the large number of taxpayers paying their business taxes and fees for year 2004, the first quarter payment period from January 1 to 20 is deemed insufficient;

WHEREAS, in the interest of the tax-paying public of Quezon City, the deadline for payment should be extended to at least ten (10) days to accommodate business tax payments without penalty;

WHEREAS, in consideration of the limitation of the present collection system to service the voluminous number of taxpayers, the City may provide for an extended grace period of time to accept payments without penalty, but, likewise, conform within the limits set by existing laws and ordinances.

WHEREAS, Section 167 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that:

"Section 167. Time of Payment - Unless otherwise provided in this Code, all local taxes, fees, and charges shall be paid within the first twenty (20) days of January or of each subsequent quarter, as the case may be. The Sanggunian concerned may, for a justifiable reason or cause, extend the time for payment of such taxes, fees, or charges without surcharges or penalties, but only for a period not exceeding six (6) months".
